

## Working Group Objective

Crowdsource input and feedback into the Phase II Transportation Electrification Plan.



### Working Group Focus Areas

- 1. EV Infrastructure
- 2. Equity
- 3. Programs and Partnerships
- 4. Goods Movement and Transit
- 5. Vehicle Grid Integration

## EVINFRASTRUCTURE

EV Infrastructure includes grid resilience, ownership of infrastructure, building codes, network optimization, and installing make readys.

# EQUITY

Equity includes effects on underserved communities, highway tax revenue, and Light Duty plug-in electric vehicle (PEV) availability.

# PROGRAMS & PARTNERSHIPS

Programs and Partnerships includes identifying barriers and programs that address them (e.g., utility programs, state programs, national programs, pilot programs).

# GOODS MOVEMENT & TRANSIT

Goods Movement and Transit including electric vehicle (EV) infrastructure, fleet charging, Medium and Heavy Duty plugin vehicle (PEV) availability.

# VEHICLE GRID INTEGRATION

Vehicle Grid Integration including grid resilience, demand response, and managed charging.

2 Meet with working group members to discuss inputs and determine key takeaways


3 Submit feedback for utilities to consider in their planning


In the next week, ILLUME will send you an email invitation inviting you to join the project SharePoint site.
